## Swimming.



Swimming will take place every Thursday from WB 11th September. Each class will be taking it in turns and going alternative weeks so the children get I hour per week of a swimming lesson.

# **Greece Lightning**

### Theme - History/Geography

The key theme of our topic is Ancient Greece. Children will learn who the Ancient Greeks were, including warfare, pottery, buildings, beliefs, alphabet, life for children, Olympic games, legacy of the Greeks.

In Geography, we will learn about what is life like in the Alps. Considering the dimate of mountain ranges and why people choose to visit the Alps; focusing on Innsbruck and looking at the human and physical features that attract tourists; investigating tourism in the local area and mapping recreational land use; presenting findings to compare the Alps to the children's own locality.

Children will learn to:

- Add and subtract numbers with more than 4-digit numbers using the formal written methods and using mental strategies and use rounding to check answers.
- Solve addition and subtraction multi-step problems in context.
- Identify, measure and draw angles and distinguish between regular and irregular polygons based on reasoning about equal sides and angles.
- Calculate the area and perimeter of rectangles.

## Computing

Learners will also take part in a collaborative online project with other class members.
